## **CURRICULUM SUPPORT**

PCSA Teacher: Charlotte McIlroy

Charlotte has worked with a different class for a half term block each. During the past year the classes have taken part in a range of curriculum areas, including, athletics, tennis and basketball

### **The impact of this work identified by staff for staff, includes:**

- Different ideas and strategies for staff on managing PE lessons, groupings and organisation
- New ideas for teaching certain elements of the curriculum
- Opportunity to see the class do PE with a specialist PE teacher, in order to pick up teaching points and for the sessions to act as CPD - this should help raise the standard of PE at Hayes

### **Impact for children identified by staff:**

- Great opportunity to do different activities that are more difficult or not possible to cover at Hayes, due to facilities and equipment
- Some of the children find it exciting to go to a different school
- They respond well to a 'different teacher'
- It is a good way to support transition for children that will be selecting PCSA as their secondary school – Y6 children have been to PCSA during the second half of the summer term

### **Challenges:**

- Access to site has caused some challenges. On occasion, the class have had to wait up to 10 minutes before the gate has been opened
- There have been internal changes to the school timetable in order to give this opportunity to different classes
- The PCSA end of summer term timetable changes will need to be considered more fully next year as this has caused us some problems this year

### **Ideas about other support that may be beneficial:**

- Advice on the right type of equipment that should be bought for the school.
- Next steps to progress the curriculum

**Alfie** – “We don’t always do PE at school, because of the weather, and it’s fun doing all the activities”
