New School Structure

Starting in September, we will have a revised leadership and phase structure, outlined as follows:

The reason for the restructure of phases is to strengthen transition between Reception and Key Stage 1 and then Key Stage 1 & Key Stage 2.

The new structure will ensure that moderation between phases is ongoing and the subject progression in Reading, Writing and Maths is given significant attention. Phase Leaders will be responsible for academic standards within their areas, timetables and the day-to-day running of their phase including staffing and matters concerning behaviour.
