

No. 60 HAYES SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

It is the policy of the school that all children will wear our agreed uniform each day. This fosters a feeling of belonging to our community, and helps children feel equal to each other. Our children are proud to wear school uniform which gives them a sense of identity and pride in belonging to Hayes School. Our uniform is simple and practical and the basic uniform is widely available.

Boys:

- Smart grey or black trousers or tailored shorts
- Navy blue polo shirt
- Jade Sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo*
- Black shoes suitable for indoor and outdoor activities (not trainers or boots.)
- White, grey or black socks

Girls:

- Smart grey or black trousers, skirts, tailored shorts or pinafore dresses
- Navy blue polo shirt
- Jade Sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo*
- Black shoes suitable for indoor and outdoor activities (not trainers or boots.)
- White, grey or black socks or tights

In the summer girls may wear blue checked dresses.

Headscarves/hijab:

These may be worn for religious reasons but must be in school colours – navy blue only. These must also be removed during PE lessons.

P.E. Kit

Coloured House T Shirts with school logo* - children are placed in Houses when they start the school

Black shorts

Footwear – Plimsolls are needed for indoor games. Trainers or plimsolls are needed for outdoor/field activities. Gymnastics is generally done in bare feet. Trainers are not allowed for indoor PE.

Winter – Jogging bottoms and long sleeved top for outside activities during the winter.

Swimming

Children in Year 4 learn to swim at Torbay Leisure Centre. This happens until they meet the National Curriculum criteria, then they graduate and their in-school P.E provision is increased. Information about what they need for swimming lessons will be given to you by the class teacher.

Jewellery

Jewellery is considered to be any form of adornment to the body, which is not clothing. This includes all kinds of earrings (studs and "sticks"), bangles and hair ornaments, at the discretion of the Headteacher.

Children will not wear any form of jewellery to school, in order to maintain their health and safety, except stud earrings and watches (no smart watches are allowed). In order to comply with health and safety guidance, stud earrings will need to be covered over during PE lessons.

Make up and nail varnish may not be worn to school.

Personal Belongings

Money and other valuables should not be brought to school, unless required for a specific activity.

Mobile phones must not be brought into school apart from for Year 5 and Year 6 children and only then if a child is walking home. If a child is walking home from school and you wish them to have a mobile phone for this purpose then this must be handed in to the class teacher for safe keeping at the beginning of the day and collected by the child before they leave the premises at the end of the day.

Lost Property

Please name all articles of clothing, as a great deal of time can be wasted looking for owners of items that are not named. Lost property is displayed regularly for families to check and claim. If items are not claimed after a term they will be offered for sale at school events, taken to charity shops or recycled.
