The year five children attended an overnight residential at Dewerstone and had a fantastic time. Year one have been enjoying becoming Aliens. Year two have been Superheroes this week and we have had a poetry day, which was enjoyed by all. We have also had Nigel, our chair of Governors, in school with his bucket this week, leading assembly and talking to the children about recycling and our responsibility to look after our planet.

We have a fully automated booking system where no clubs, dinners or trips will be able to be booked unless there are funds in the Scopay account so please make sure you keep up with payments. You can choose every school meal for your child on Scopay, including fillings for sandwiches and jacket potatoes. Please note: jacket potatoes are available on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays and sandwiches are available Wednesdays and Fridays. You can book up to six weeks in advance.

The Developing Curriculum

Our staff have been working extremely hard to develop all subject areas across the school. From Art to Science each member of staff responsible for a subject area, has been working with teachers across the school to ensure every subject is covered comprehensively. We want to develop young people as critical thinkers with a depth of knowledge that empowers them to think creatively. The foundation of this is our curriculum statement.

Our Curriculum Vision

At Hayes, we strive for our children to push beyond any perceived idea of potential, to be all they can be, regardless of background. Our vision is for all of our children to leave us as good human beings- happy, kind and responsible. Our curriculum is integral in shaping the children to become independent and life-long learners.

Our curriculum aims to equip our children with the ability to 'think' in order to make sense of an ever-changing world. The breadth our curriculum provides is underpinned by thinking. This thinking will allow our children to make sense of the world around and before them in order that they can live fulfilling and happy lives, being all they can be.

NURSERY

The Nursery children have been using good spreading and cutting skills whilst making sandwiches. During Music, they heard the story of how some Christians believe that God sent a flood and Noah built a boat to keep the animals safe. They learnt the Noah's Ark song and represented animals using instruments.











RECEPTION

Reception have been reading the story 'Funny Bones', creating spooky potions and houses, writing, leaf printing, building a tunnel and mark-making in their environment. For National Poetry Day, they were inspired by the poem 'Leaves' and have written a poem about things they see in Autumn.




















Year 1 have been exploring the book "Commotion in the Ocean" and have learned various poems about sea creatures. They memorised and acted out some poems!














Year 2 have had Superhero Day and have some great Bilca work going on. The children used their sewing skills to make the t-shirts they designed for their own superhero.























In Year 3, Orangutans have really enjoyed drawing part of a Seawig from 'Oliver and the Seawigs'. They have also enjoyed their Science and Maths link lessons investigating what happens when an object is moved further way from a light source. 








In Year 6, the children have been learning about the components of blood and how these are important for the body to function correctly. They have created blood models using yellow food colouring for the plasma, red food colouring and Cheerios for the red blood cells, marshmallows for white blood cells and oats for the platelets.
