Ordering School Dinners, Trips and Clubs

When you log on to Scopay, there is a HELP section at the top of the page which links to FAQs and guidance on paying for items online and booking parents evening sessions.

If you have not got your Scopay account set up yet, please speak to the reception staff as soon as possible.

We have a fully automated booking system where no clubs, dinners or trips will be able to be booked unless there are funds in the Scopay account so please make sure you keep up with payments. You can choose every school meal for your child on Scopay, including fillings for sandwiches and jacket potatoes. Please note: jacket potatoes are available on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays and sandwiches are available Wednesdays and Fridays. You can book up to six weeks in advance.

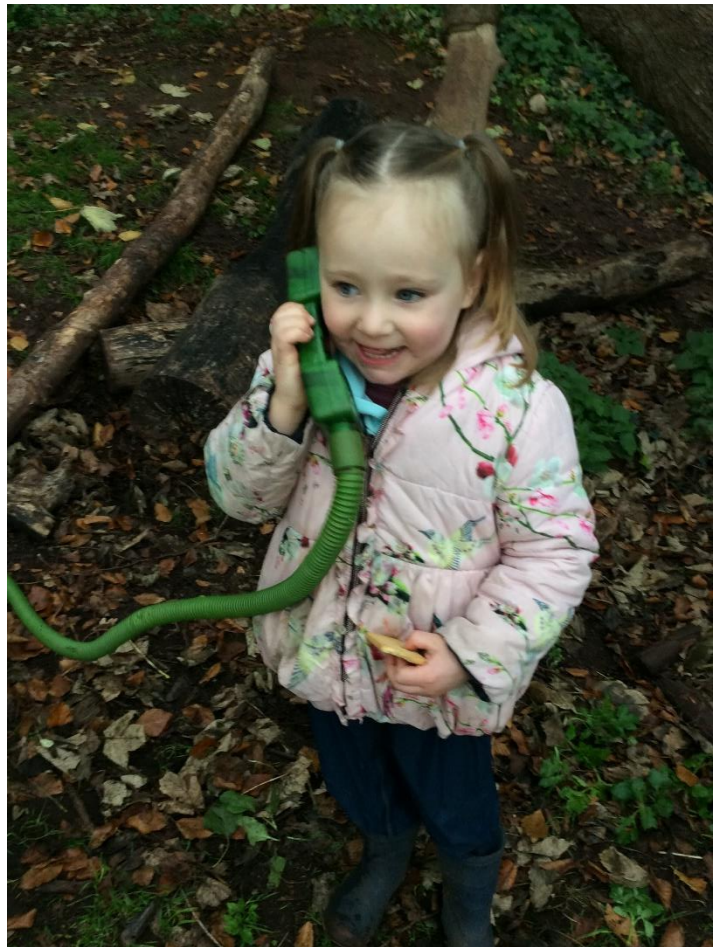




At Forest School, the Nursery children and staff all enjoyed the woods as they explored the world around them, shared their learning and findings and worked together as a team.

Year 2 really sparkled and shone in their nativity 'Born this night'. They were all amazing!

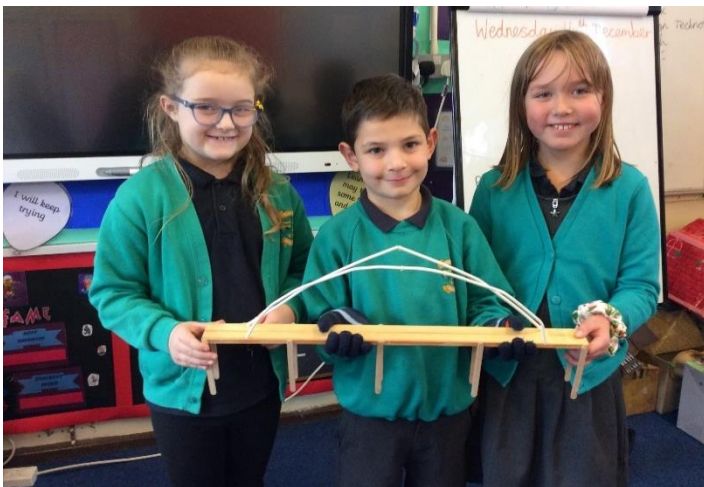
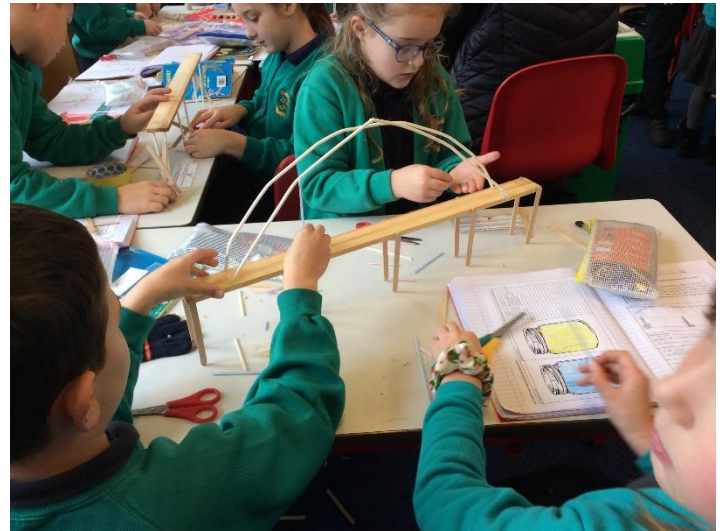
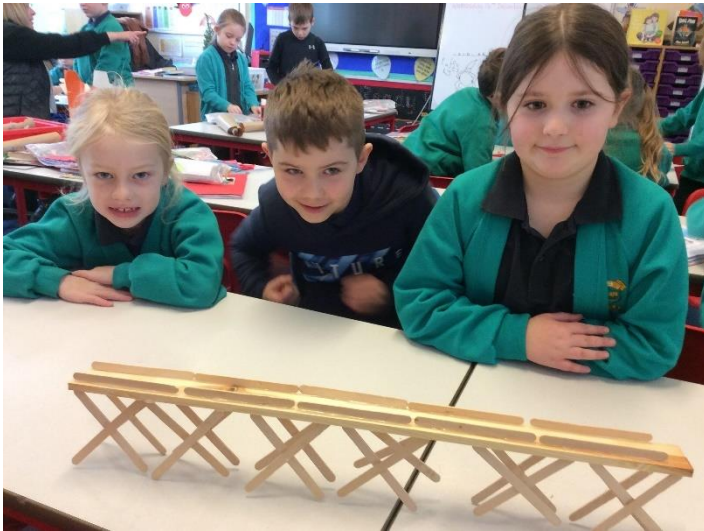


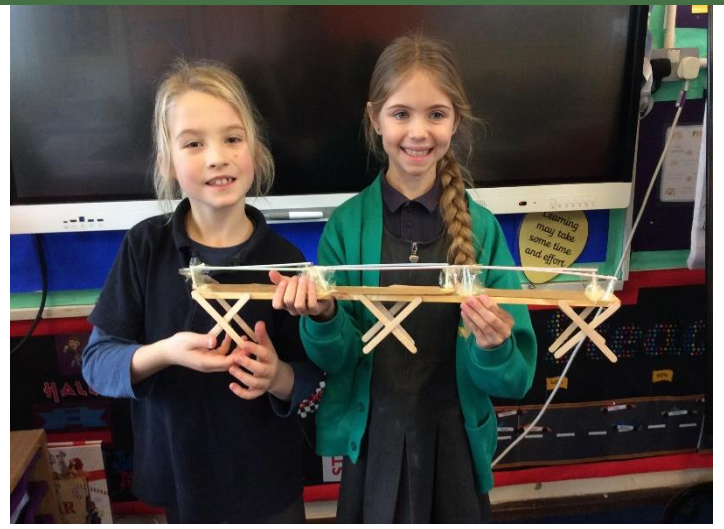
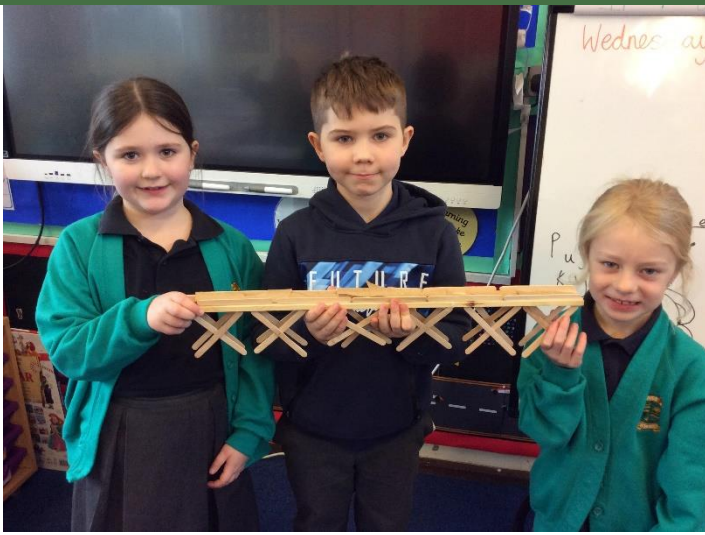




Year 3

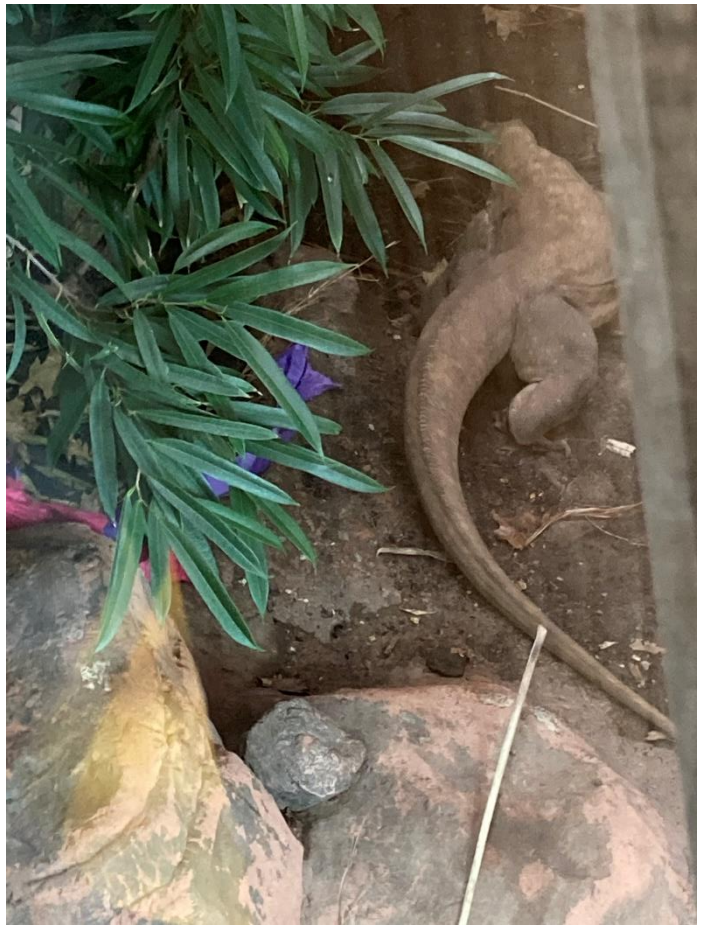
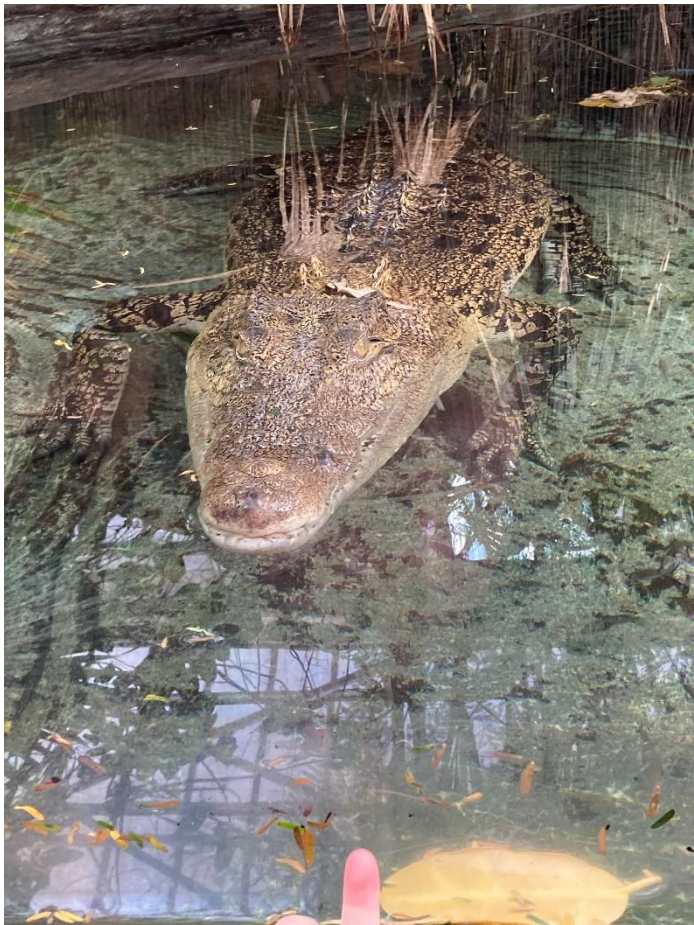

Gorillas were set the challenge of identifying all those endangered species throughout our time in the zoo. The children demonstrated great empathy during the day.

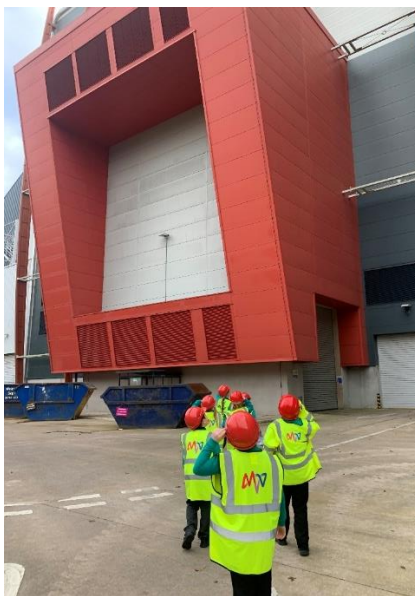






Year 4

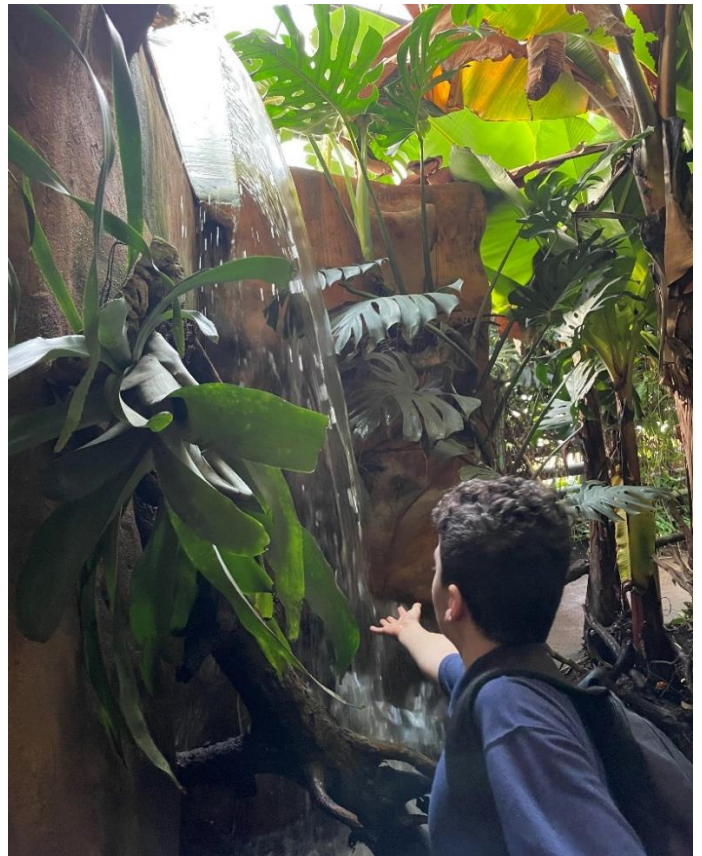
