As Easter draws ever closer the atmosphere around the school feels as productive as ever with the children working diligently in their classrooms. Our School improvement partner visited us this term and noted how calm and productive every area of the school is. The children and teachers should be rightly proud of all they have achieved this term. I cannot visit a classroom without the children enthusiastically sharing the achievements in their learning. It really is one of the best parts of my job!

The children's learning experiences have been interesting and wide-ranging as ever during the term. In Nursery we have been learning about toads after a child rescued one on the pavement on the way to school. Rest assured - it was then released into a natural environment! Reception children have been learning about 'Everyday Heroes' as part of their Supertato book, as well as learning all about money. We have also been making toy dragons using sliders and levers in Y1. Years 2 to 6 had a visit from Tomas Williams, the education outreach officer for the Houses of Parliament. I was thrilled to see such an amazing turnout from all of you at parents evening. It was lovely catching up with many of you and I would like to take this opportunity to thank those of you who filled in feedback forms. The focus of the survey was around wellbeing and mental health, our approaches to tackling bullying, and the provision for those of you who have children with SEND. Whilst these were overwhelmingly positive, we have notified staff where we have needed to follow up in a few cases. Please continue to notify us if you have any concerns at all. We are proud to be very proactive in being an anti-bullying school and pride ourselves in the relationships we have between teachers and parents as a partnership in order to get it right for your child.

Dinner Money Increase from September 2023

Hayes School has not raised dinner money prices for over ten years now and we are very proud of our catering provision at school. We are facing rising costs and still wish to retain the quality of food provided. Therefore, our Governors have decided that we need to raise the price of school dinners. From 4th September 2023, we will charge £2.30 for a main meal, dessert and drink.

Ordering School Dinners, Trips and Clubs

All trips, dinner money, breakfast club and after school club bookings and payments must be made online via Scopay. If you have not got your Scopay account set up yet, please speak to the reception staff as soon as possible.

We have a fully automated booking system where no clubs, dinners or trips will be able to be booked unless there are funds in the Scopay account so please make sure you keep up with payments. You can choose every school meal for your child on Scopay, including fillings for sandwiches and jacket potatoes. You can book up to six weeks in advance.


OUR LEARNING

NURSERY













RECEPTION


















Year 1's hook day was based on "Adventures of the Egg Box Dragon" and they have been painting dragons, making dragon caves with clay, and writing fairy tales about dragons. In Design and Technology, the children learnt to make levers and sliders. They created a dragon toy for the Nursery children with moving wings and tail as well as fire, which appeared from the dragon's mouth. They have also been building Lego and Duplo 'Sukkah' when learning about the Jewish festival of 'Sukkot'.





















This term, year 2 designed and made puppets on their hook day. They looked at the new character in their story 'Claude in the city' and made a sock puppet friend for him. They also had a book scavenge activity with their reading buddies from Year 6.
