
Dear Children of Year Six 2023,



Ordering School Dinners, Trips and Clubs

We have a fully automated booking system where no clubs, dinners or trips will be able to be booked unless there are funds in the Scopay account so please make sure you keep up with payments. You can choose every school meal for your child on Scopay, including fillings for sandwiches and jacket potatoes. You can book up to six weeks in advance.

Online Safety

Ofcom Children & parents' media use & attitudes report 2022

This report looks at media use, attitudes and understanding among children and young people aged 3-17. It includes findings on parents' views about their children's media use, and how parents of children and young people aged 3-17 monitor and manage their children's use. Ofcom findings include:

Online access and attitudes

- Nearly all children went online in 2021 (99%)
- The majority used a mobile phone (72%)

Online behaviours

- Video-sharing platforms (VSPs) (YouTube/TikTok) was the most popular for ages 3-17
- 31% posted content they had made themselves, especially those aged 12-17
- YouTube was the most widely used by children
- 89% used You Tube, compared to half using TikTok

Online profiles

- Most children under 13 had their own profile on at least one social media app or site
- 33% of parents of 5-7s said their child had a profile
- More than 6 in 10 children 8-17 had more than one profile on online apps and sites (62%); the most common reason was having one just for family or friends to see.
- 4 in 10 parents of 3-17s knew minimum age for most apps; 42% correctly said 13.
- 4 in 10 parents of 8-11-year-olds said they would allow their child to use social media (38%). Access and download the full report here.

Reception children have had visits from Animal HQ and have been looking after their secret garden.



















Year 2 had a great time at the zoo last week, to complete their learning experience. They especially enjoyed visiting the giraffes and the reptiles












Year 3 have been mixing and creating colours with paint to create their own versions of famous paintings.























Below is a selection of the fabulous work of Year 5 on dragons and dragon eyes.





