


Year 3 Curriculum Plan: Autumn 2023

Learning experience, context and outcome

By the end of this learning experience, the children will have good knowledge of the text 'Oliver and the Seawigs' by Philip Reeve and Sarah McIntyre. The children will know that Oliver grew up in a family of explorers - but his biggest adventure is about to begin. With his new friends - a grumpy old albatross, a short-sighted mermaid and a friendly island called Cliff - Oliver goes off in search of his missing parents. But before he can put his rescue plan into action, there's an army of pesky sea monkeys to contend with.... We will think about the school value of friendship - How does Oliver build a friendship with the characters he meets on his journey to find his parents?

Art is our driver subject for this learning experience. The children's first outcome will be to develop their drawing techniques by drawing and revising the parts of the seawigs. Using 'Austin's Butterfly and ELF on ELF discussions, Year 3 will focus on reviewing and improving their drawing skills. Our second outcome will be focusing on creating a 3D Seawig using paper sculpture. The children will practise their paper folding skills to create a variety of different shapes and patterns.

Geography is our second driver subject. Using the text as a hook into their learning, the children will develop their knowledge of human and physical geography. Year 3 will know what an island is and study two comparative islands - the UK and Malta. The children will use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied. Google Earth could be used to view and locate both islands comparative sizes, capital cities, structure. We will study the land formation and compare what is the same and different about both islands.

ENGLISH

- Driver Text: Oliver and the Seawig by Philip Reeves and Sarah McIntyre.
- Reading: Whole Class reading takes place each week including fluency, retrieval and inference based around a variety of texts.
- Read, write, Inc will continue in groups for children to secure phonics and fluency.
- Writing Opportunities: The children will learn to write a diary entry and a non-chronological report about a Seawig
- Spelling focus: prefixes, words endings sure and ture
- Handwriting: joined, legible and cursive handwriting.

MATHS: Place value


In maths, the children will be focusing on:


- Add and subtract using the column method with exchanges.

- Multiply and divide by 3, 4 and 8.





SCIENCE: Light

In science, the children will learn:

- About different sources of light.
- How the sun's light can be dangerous.
- Investigate reflective materials and reflective surfaces.
- Create their own shadow puppets play using knowledge and skills of light and shadows.

COMPUTING: Data

In computing, the children will learn to:

- To sort objects using just 'yes' or 'no' questions.
- To complete a branching database using 2Question.
- To create a branching database of the children's choice.
