Context and Outcome



During this half-term, the children will learn how to create facial expressions in art and how the expression reflect the mood.


Leon and the place between



Year 4: Summer 1 2024

Driver Subject: ART

This term, year 4 pupils will be looking expressions trough portraits linking in to our zones of regulations.

Over this half-term, we will look at the different expressions we show on our faces and how we can create these expressions using different drawing techniques. We will study the work of Fred Hatt and how he creates portraits to show mood and feeling. Pupils will build on previous drawing skills by using hatching, stippling, contouring and other skills, The final outcome will be to create an expressive portrait to show a chosen emotion and add colour to the background to depict the mood and atmosphere.



Year 4: Summer 1 2024

SCIENCE

This term in Science, we will be looking at the topic of sound. The rock stars of the world need our help! They want our pupils to come to their concerts and rock-out, but they want them to protect their precious ears!

The children will find out all about sound; for example, how it travels as-well-as pitch and volume. They investigate materials to see which will provide the best insulation against sound.

The children will make systematic and careful observations and, where appropriate, take accurate measurements using standard units, using a range of equipment, including thermometers and data loggers.

COMPUTING

In their computing lessons, the children will be learning about animation and using an online programme to create their own animations. They will also learn what artificial intelligence are and how it can enhance and impact our lives.

MUSIC

For music, we will be learning about how music shapes our way of life. We will be learning about Improvisation using the cords C, D, E, F, G and through composition we will learn the major and minor chords creating music to represent the a mood for a film clip.

R.E

This term in R.E., we will be looking at how Good Friday links to the Pentecost and what the Pentecost means to Christians. We will look at the story that stained glass windows tell about the Pentecost and create our own.

PSHE

In PSHE this term, we are looking at the importance of physical exercise to help keep us fit and healthy. In support of this we will also be discussing why we should aim to eat a balanced diet. We explore the different food groups and suggest ways in which we can increase the amount of healthy meals we eat.

MFL (French)

In French this term, pupils will be taught the vocabulary for items within a tearoom. By the end of this unit pupils will have the knowledge and skills to present both orally and in written form about what they will and will not find in a tearoom.

<u>P.E</u>

This term, we will continue to apply and develop a broader range of skills, learning how to use them in different ways and to link them through athletics, learning to work as a team and alone. They should develop an understanding of how to improve in different physical activities and sports.
