

Process for Children Ordering School Dinners - Wrist Bands

To ensure children get the meal they want and that the kitchen can plan for the number and type of meals needed, we have reviewed how meals are ordered and taken in the kitchen.

How it works:

- An envelope of wristbands is kept in each class.
- When registers are taken, children place orders for meals - the teacher explains the choices available on the menu
- Children order either a Hot meat meal, jacket potato, vegetarian option or sandwich/wrap/baguette (see band colours below)
- Registers are provided to the kitchen by 9.15.
- Children are given a wristband prior to lunchtime. They show the kitchen their band and received the appropriate meal choice with drink and dessert.
- Children return their bands to the class envelope when they return from lunch.

Colour codes:

Red band = Main school meal (meat option)

Yellow band = Jacket potato

Green band = vegetarian hot meal option

Green band = Baguette / wrap / sandwich
